The Clark Foundation Outward Bound Scholarship For Educators is awarded to eligible applicants employed by one of our scholarship schools who wish to enrich their school/ community by way of their Outward Bound experience. It is hoped that participation in this extraordinary opportunity will help re-ignite and nurture those qualities necessary to help others achieve *their* goals.

You are free to select any course offered by Outward Bound that is offered in the United States. You need not feel obligated to consider only short (less expensive) courses: but, keep in mind that we are trying to award as many scholarships as possible and the number of scholarships available, are limited.

If interested, please complete the attached application and return it to Clark Sports Center (address below). Also please include as detailed summary (as possible) of anticipated expenses including tuition, application fee, Outward Bound travel charges specific to your course, lodging, and airfare. Incidental costs (food, clothing, etc.) will be your responsibility, and will not be reimbursed. Please remember to keep accurate records of all covered expenditures.

If you receive, and accept, a scholarship you will need to pay the initial application fee (deposit) to Outward Bound. This will ensure your spot on your course. Also, please pay their optional \$75.00 cancellation insurance fee. *All of these monies will be reimbursed upon completion of your course.* The Clark Foundation will pay the balance of your course tuition cost directly to Outward Bound, according to their payment schedule.

Please remember to mention to your Outward Bound course contact person, that you are receiving a scholarship from The Clark Foundation/Clark Sports Center.

You will need to make arrangements for, and pay, your own transportation/lodging, which will be reimbursed after your course is completed. The Clark Foundation will not reimburse any monies forfeited to travel agent, airline cancellation, or Outward Bound cancellation fees.
