

School Break Days FAQ

1. What are School Break Days?

School Break Days are times when school is not in session (holidays and school breaks). These replace what was previously called the "No School Schedule."

2. How are School Break Days different from the After School Activity Program?

The After School Activity Program takes place each regular school day and is structured and supervised by staff. School Break Days provide opportunities for youth and families, when school is not in session (holidays and school breaks) but follow the same supervision expectations outlined in the November 6, 2025 policy.

3. Why did the name change from "No School Schedule"?

In the past, these days often resembled an "open building" concept where children moved freely throughout the building. With the November 6 policy update, we've shifted to a model that provides a safer environment for all members.

4. What are the supervision requirements during School Break Days?

Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by a responsible adult, defined as someone 18 years or older, who remains in the building.

5. Do Building Hours change during School Break Days?

No. *Building Hours* remain in effect for all members. *School Break Days* simply designate times when youth and families can participate during school breaks, with the same supervision expectations outlined in the November 6 policy.

Please Note: Building Hours may be adjusted, or may include closure, if inclement weather occurs. Updates will be communicated promptly to members.

6. Where can I find the full policy?

The complete policy update adopted on November 6 is available through our member communications and at the front desk. We encourage all families to review it for full details.

7. What will happen on unexpected school closure days like a snow day?

Hours and schedules will not change. After school programming will not take place, however program areas may be open during that time. Children under 12 will need to be accompanied by an adult as per our November 6 policy update.
